USRRC Super National To Be Run At Glen

Club racing will take on a new status in 1978 with the beginning of the SCCA's first USRRC Super National races at 12 sites around the country.

"The Super National races are designed to showcase SCCA's Club Racing while at the same time generating and attracting more media attention," says Club Racing Director Tex Arnold. They all will be spectator events and should draw good fields and attendance.

Super Nationals will be run with all the recognized SCCA classes. However, a new scoring system will award 15 points for each first place finish and distribute points through ten places.

Point totals from the Super Nationals, slong with other 1978 USRRC finishes, will be totaled for the run-offs at Road Atlanta.

Existing rules which state a driver may count only two events outside Division races still apply.

SCCA NAMES PRESS OFFICER

The appointment of John Dalton as National Press Officer has been announced by SCCA Executive Director Prom Duval.

Dalton will assume duties immediately, replacing Dinah Chapman, who leaves SCCA after a long tenure as chief press representative for the group.

SCCA MARKS YEAR OF CHANGE, PROGRESS

With plans already underway for an innovative 1978 season, the 1977 SCCA campaign will be remembered as one of change and progress.

Sanctionaing 39 professional races in the Citicorp Can-Am Challenge, the Trans-American Championship, the Robert Bosch VW Gold Cup and Scirocco/Bilstein Cup which played to 913,448 spectators, a total of 270 events in club racing, nine Pro Rallies and over 500 Club Rallies along with "explosive" growth in Solo events, the SCCA fulfilled its commitment to sanction and conduct nearly every major road course event in the country in 1977.

Added to the schedule for 1978 is a program designed to meet the motoring needs of a changing world. Begun in late 1977, the SCCA-Department of Energy-Citicorp Economy Challenge matches drivers against courses laid out to include city, suburban and highway driving in efforts to obtain highest possible mileage measured against Environmental Protection Agency standards.

Nearly 50 Economy Runs will be conducted in 1978, and says Executive Director Tom Duval, "They will provide realistic information to both manufacturers and drivers, and as the sanctioning body we feel SCCA has become the leader in economy-performance driving."

Club racing, with 66 National races, 147 Regionals and 57 Driver Schools, was enthusiastically received during 1977 and promises to be equally exciting in 1978.

"We are very optimistic about 1978 with the advent of the USRRC Super Nationals," says SCCA Club Racing Director Tex Arnold.



1977 Activities Annual Report to Denver

The year, 1977, was a very productive one for the Glen Region. Besides the feat of maintaining an active calendar of some 40 events for the membership, we launched a "total" program of public relations in order to put the image of the Glen Region and the SCCA before the eyes and ears of

the community of which we are a part.

Under enthusiastic leadership, the PR committee kept the media informed of all events in a timely manner and have been personally commended for the effort by members of the press. The most vivid example of our community involvement was in the production of a "multi-interest" car show, complete with films, slides, prizes and free publicity of the SCCA, and was held in the new Civic Center Arena in Corning, N.Y. In as small a community as we reside, the participation and attendance was gratifying, and a great deal of interest in the SCCA activities was evident.

We re-activated our sponsorship of the BSA Explorer Post in the field of motorsports; developed a very attractive brochure for visual consumption; and have readied an informative and very complete slide show series to take to the

community meeting groups.

This concentrated effort of better promoting ourselves and our activities will no doubt reflect a greater rise in new members for the SCCA in the next year, although we maintained our average of 56 new members for 1977. The "Membership Contest" we instituted at the suggestion of the National Membership Chairman was well received, with many members competing for the coveted prize. A definite growth in the Solo II and Rally Programs was shown this year with a 25 per cent increase in attendance for Solo IIs, and a 15 per cent increase for rallys.

These events are totally supported by club members and guests from the area, as there are no large marque clubs to assist in the participation. In demonstration of our organizational ability we have been awarded a date for a DOE Economy Run for 1978, and have been chosen as the site for the NEDIV Solo II Runoffs for

Meanwhile, our mainstay-the race program, both amateur and professional-at Watkins Glen, maintained its high level of performance with a large majority of our membership assisting in the various race departments from May through October. Historically, not ever having an abundance of drivers in the past, this year there were three first place winners and a number of lower places in the Area 10 Championship Series for regional race events.

Always on the lookout for ways to improve the race organization-whether with personnel or with equipment-we purchased a truck to carry a fire unit and to be used in other regional activities, and incorporated a new public address system for better communication.

In keeping with our philosophy of maintaining the broad scope of activities that SCCA has to offer, we became a member of the PHA (Pa. Hillclimb Assoc.), in order to improve participation in our Solo I event. We made plans to conduct a hillclimb in the state of Pennsylvania, but our plans were halted due to

governmental restrictions.

To say that our members are busy and active is a gross understatement; we try to have relaxation and just plain fun, too. A new concept for us-a program committee-was begun to enhance the general business meetings-complete with lotteries, door prizes, and even

decal swapping.

Our year began with an extraordinary happening-the Twentieth Anniversary Party which was an historical meeting of the "olde timers" and the more active members in one unified group; and we will end the year with the Christmas and Awards Party with the same spiritthat of a feeling of pride and accomplishment in belonging to the Glen Region, SCCA, Inc.

Congratulations to Peter Argetsinger, son of Glen Region members Cameron and Jean Argetsinger, 1977 British Racing and Sports Car Club Driver

The award will be presented at ceremonies to be held January 28th at Bury St. Edmunds,

Argetsinger consistently placed high in the club's super competitive Formula Ford Championship during the past year, entering a total of 64 races.

A Look at the Past with Bill Green

In October, 1932 the Assocition International des Automobile Clubs Reconnus, now known as the Federation International de l'Automobile (FIA), drew up the 750 Kg or 1500 Cwt formula for Grand Prix Cars.

This formula specified that a car could weigh no more than 750 Kg without the driver, fuel and tires. There were no limitations on engine size or horsepower. The minimum frontal area, governed by body width, had to be at least 33% inches.

This formula was to run from 1934 to 1936, however, it was extended to be the standard in 1937. This formula produced the fastest road racing cars the world would ever see, namely Mercedes-Benz and Auto Union.

The 1937 W125 Mercedes-Benz Grand Prix car developed 646 horsepower @ 5800 rpm, based on a 5.6 litre supercharged straight 8 engine. The regular team drivers were Rudolf Caracciola, Manfred von Brauchitsch, Herman Lang and Dick

The C type Auto Unions produced 550 horsepower @ 5,000 rpm, with a supercharged 6 litre V-16 engine, mounted in the rear. The Auto Union team sported such drivers as Bernd Rosemeyer, Hans Von Stuck, Rudolf Hasse, and Luigi Fagioli. Towards the end of the 1937 season Tazio Nuvolari left the Alfa Romeo team and joined Auto Union as a regular.

Both of these German cars were capable of speeds of around 210 mph. The Alfa Romeo and Maserati marques were far out-classed in both horsepower and handling capabilities. Auto Union and Mercedes-Benz competed in 12 major races during 1937, below are the race results:
