The Kimberly Cup - History

The Kimberly Cup is the most prestigious award that a licensed SCCA driver can win. The Cup is awarded to the driver showing the greatest improvement in competition during the past year. This selection is made by the National SCCA Competition Board.

The cup was donated to the club by James H. Kimberly in 1954 and has been awarded every year since. Kimberly, a retired executive of the Kimberly-Clark Paper Company, joined the SCCA in 1948. From that time his name has been prominent in both his own racing success and in his active participation in club administration.

Kimberly raced at the Glen in 1950, 1951, 1952, and 1954. However, he never won a race - he only placed. In 1954 Kimberly won the CM National Class while driving his Ferrari. Shortly after the 1958 season, Kimberly retired from active competition.

He helped sponsor the Cooper-Climax that Jack Brabham drove at Indy in 1961. He also had interests in Indy entries the following year.

Fifteen Years Ago In The SPARKPLUG

The passing of the great Jim Clark was memorialized by fellow-Scot Bill Petrie, in part as follows: "He was a driver of exceptional ability, as we all know, but more than that he was a 'gentle-man' in the true original meaning of that phrase." Our cover photo showed him in a pensive mood, sitting in his Lotus 49 in the pits before the 1967 USGP, which he was to win in his last Glen appearance.

On a happier note, Jim Dix and Bob Bruce presented the results of their Glen Region Survey of Automobiles. The 215 members laid claim to 249 vehicles, classified as 80 utility cars, 76 genuine sports cars, 33 Jeeps, 3 open-wheel racing cars, and 1 motor home. No less than 41 marques were represented, led by 52 Fords and 34 Chevrolets. MG (19), VW (17), Plymouth (12), and Porsche (11) were the other nameplates in double figures, closely followed by the odd trio of Pontiac, Citroen, and Rambler. (No, Ade, there's nothing odd about a Tin Indian... it just doesn't seem to fit next to a 2CV!)

Speaking of those 215 members, no less than 14 came on board that month. Notable among them were Bill and Peggy Miller, the former destined to become a two-term R.E., and Gordon Barkley, whose Autodynamics Formula Vee was to frustrate our autocross efforts with the Elva Junior for years to come.

Partly in view of the rosy membership picture, Bill Bradshaw's R.E. Report quoted a current TV commercial: "We must be doing something right!" Bill noted that the Glen had long been able to lay claim to the title of "just about the best racing Region in the country", and pointed to SCCA's approval of the unprecedented August National-TransAm as proof. But in addition, he pointed out the rapid growth of rally activities, including plans to stage a divisional rally in 1969, and the purchase of the Heuer timing equipment for gymkhanas as signals that the Region was in a major period of growth. And right he was, for at the next convention, we were to be honored with the Regional Achievement Award.

The Kimberly Cup Cont'd

Some of the various offices he held in the club over the years were: member of the National Contest Board and Chairman of the National Activities Committee in 1955; President of the SCCA in 1956 and 1957; served on the Board of Governors in 1961 and 1962, and was Vice-Chairman of that Board in 1961. Kimberly was awarded the cup that bears his name in 1954 and the Woolf Barnato Trophy in 1959.

Top position Again this year went to the Sheehe Family, Kathy and brother Jerry, who finished with 28 points. The Whitcomb Ford Award went to 4th place finishers Bob and Kevin Robinson, driving a Lincoln and scoring 85 points.

Solo II News

The Solo II Board met March 27th and prepared the 1983 Supplemental Regulations. There have been several major changes in National rules and in our Regional rules.

This year there will normally be a practice run before the timed runs, unless weather or other circumstances make it impossible. There will also be a minimum of three timed runs. Penalty points for hitting pylons were increased from one to two seconds.

The bumping order has been dropped, and trophies will be awarded for one car classes. Along with this, the Driver of the Year award has been dropped. There will now be a Solo IIer of the Year, based on participation in Championship events and contribution to the Solo II program. This person will be selected by the Solo II Board and submitted to the Board of Directors for final approval. This award is open to all Glen Region members, who compete in at least half of the Solo II events.

The Chief Solo II safety steward at each event will receive 120 points toward his class standings, if he does not compete in the event. There will also be a Novice class this year. The Solo II Board is currently working on a system to fairly present awards in this class.




