At the Annual Business Meeting in November Bob Burns made the following presentation:
"In St. Paul last February, while attending the SCAA National Convention, the thought came to several delegates that perhaps the Glen Region should have an award similar to the SCCA's prestigious Woolf Barnato Award, that is awarded annually to a SCCA member. The idea of such an award remained dormant for several months. We were reminded that this was a pretty good thought and that we should develop the idea of how best to give some sort of recognition to the outstanding accomplishments of a Region member. Well... more time went by, but finally it became apparent of the movements of a Glen Region member.

The parameters for awarding the award are as follows:

- 1. The awardee must have been a member of the Region for at least ten years.
- 2. The awardee must have made a sigificant and outstanding contribution to the Region within the ten year period above and beyond the call of duty to further benefit the Region in all areas: Motor Racing, Rallying, Solo Programs, Administration of the Region and the Social and Educational Programs of the Region.
- 3. The Award will be presented at each Annual Business Meeting of the Region.
- 4. Selection of the recipient will be made by a panel of the past three recipients of the award.
- 5. Until we have three recipients a panel of Glen Region members, two members and the past recipient will form the panel.

This award does have the majority approval of the BOD and has been financed from private funds.

# Fifteen Years Ago In The SPARKPLUG

A cover drawing of Santa Claus driving a Formula 1 car with his sack of presents in the engine bay heralded the annual Christmas Party issue. The artwork was the product of Frank Evans of Sayre, an antique car enthusiast who is better known today as a railroad historian and artist.

The M&M Club in Montour Falls was the site for the Christmas Party, featuring Bob Tullius as guest speaker. In summarizing Tullius' remarks, we noted that he paid tribute to his sponsor, Quaker State. Evidently the oil company's marketing people were pleased with the way he represented their products, because the Quaker State name is still on his car 15 years later. In fact, the corporate lineage of the Jaguar XJR5 he races today can be traced back to the Triumphs campaigned by the Group 44 team in club races during the '68 season, but while the racing team remained stable, the corporation, then known as British Leyland Motors, has gone through a bewildering series of reorganizations and government bailouts. Maybe racers aren't the worst businessmen after all...

John McQuillen was the major recipient of awards for competitive club events, winning his class in the gymkhana point standings and tying for the rally drivers' championship with Dusty Rhoades. Bill Bradshaw and Shirley Brown were next in the drivers' results, while Elinor Rhoades and Carlton Brown topped the navigators.

From an historical standpoint, the most significant event at the party was the inauguration of the RE's Award, presented then, as now, to the member contributing the most to the Region's success, as chosen by the Regional Executive. The first winner, hailed as "one of our most tireless workers", was Shirley Brown.

George Gould reported from the NEDIV Convention in Washington that discussion had centered on a number of points, some of them unique to that period in SCCA history, while others continue to generate controversy today. In the first category would fall the definition of solo events ("...60 mph in third gear sounds like Solo I, not Solo II") and the desirability of tougher rollbar standards, while scheduling problems, point-keeping requirements, and what to do about DSR racing with other classes are issues that are still with us today.

Results of the American Road Race of Champions, held that year at Riverside, showed Bob Tullius' Group 44 taking home the national championships in DP, with John Kelly driving a TR4, and FP, with Brian Fuerstenau in a Spitfire. Kelly remains active today, racing his Elva Courier, as do title winners Don Devendorf, Ron Grable, and (who else?) Jerry Hansen.

Rallymaster awards were presented to Tom Sparling and Craig Champlain, Maryann Pradon and Dave Redfield, Stu Luther and Jay Puskenalis, Carl Matuszek and Joe Carozzoni, Tom Sparling and Ed Cordes, Bill and Pauline Bradshaw, Ed and Gail Cordes, Dave and Connie Davies, Ade Ketchum and Lyn Rexford and Todd English and Bob Pinkston.

Rally sponsor appreciation plaques were presented to the following: Bully Hill Vineyards, J.S. Barr, KZ-106, Pierri's Restaurant, Sparling AMS/Oil, Atkinson AMS/Oil, Frank the Tailor, Corning NewChannels, Scuteri's, Seneca Lodge, Whitcomb Ford and Los Ponchos Restaurant.

Jim Reynolds of Whitcomb Ford, which has sponsored the "Best Placed Ford" award at each rally, was on hand to present the year end award. Classy Ford jackets went to Ade Ketchum and Lyn Rexford, who competed in Ade's Ford LTD. (Who says it doesn't pay to rally in luxury?)

The 1983 Glen Region Rally Championship awards were presented in both the Driver and Navigator categories. For the Drivers, Carl Matuszek and Ade Ketchum tied for first, with Ed Cordes third. For the Navigators, Lyn Rexford was first, Joey Carozzoni - second and Connie Davies - third.

Bob Burns, Contest Board Chairman, was next up to present the race program awards. Race chairmen were recognized and presented with mementoes, in appreciation of their collective outstanding job during this most difficult year at the track. The race chairmen included: Bill Bradshaw and Jerry Buckbee for the Drivers School, Roger Holman and Tim Meddaugh for the Glen 100, Bert and Helen Cooley for the Glen National, Dave Davies and Tom Sparling for the August Sprints, and Jim Magincalda for the Skip Barber School. Kathy Hirt of the Washington D.C. Region was presented a plaque in thanks to her and the D.C. Region for the use of their radios during the racing season.

Moving on to the year-end driver's awards, Bob pointed out that 12% of our membership hold some kind of competition license. In raw numbers 11 hold novice or logs, 12 hold regional licenses and 16 hold national licenses. Dave Beach was named the Novice Driver of the Year, Jim Brown the Regional Driver of the Year, and Clint Welding took National Driver of the Year honors.

The Glen Region Driver of the Year award is the racing program's most prestigious award and is based not only on accomplishments on the track but also on contribution to the Region. This year's recipient became a member in 1977, amassed 169 points in GP - good for 1st in GP and 2nd in overall points in NYSRRC cometition, and was instrumental in the Jaws of Life fundraising campaign - he is Bob Rynone.

Bob also spoke about the success of the Jaws of Life fund that was started some three years ago, and this year finally saw the purchase of

this important piece of equipment. DORY Racing got involved, because they saw the need for the Jaws and felt they could help in the fund drive. Help they did! They worked with the race chairmen over the last two years on raffles and also in the preparation of various dinners at the track. Their barbecued chicken and rigatoni dinners have become renown. The DORY Racing team - Bob Rynone, Linda Spicer, Bob Robinson, Colin Robinson, chef John Corsi, Fred Douglas, Joel Clinton and Jay Puskenalis were presented special recognition awards in appreciation of their tireless efforts to see the Jaws fund reach its goal. The Region, as well as all who race at the Glen, owe DORY Racing a big thanks!

Regional Executive Norm Glueck recognized honored guests, noted the 25th anniversary of member Bill Green and offered congratulations to the award winners. To incoming RE Bob Burns he presented the gavel and the RE's pin, which is passed from RE to RE and which was formerly the late Bob Stephens' pin. Norm also presented Bob with a jaunty plaid cap, which Norm said "will distinguish him in all the state". (Or was it that it would distinguish Burnsey in whatever state he was in?)

So, congratulations to all the award winners, thanks to the many chairmen and committee members and also let us not forget to thank all those "regular" members who competed but did not win, who worked rallies, solos and races so others could compete, who stuffed envelopes, got beer, wrote press releases, got the sponsors, built the tire walls, worked on the Sparkplug, and did any job, no matter what it was, that needed to be done.
