## Fifteen Years Ago In The SPARKPLUG

One of the proudest moments in Glen Region history was realized at the SCCA National Convention in Denver when the Glen was presented the Regional Achievement Award for 1968 in the Large Region category. Making the award even more impressive was the fact that the runners-up were two of the largest metropolitan regions in the country, San Francisco and Washington, D.C.

Recognized names among the individual award winners included Dave Tallaksen, the "Mouth of the South", who took the Woolf Barnato Trophy for outstanding contributions to SCCA, and Tony Adamowicz, who received the Tim Mayer Fund of \$1000, established in memory of the late Pennsylvania driver (and younger brother of McLaren's Teddy Mayer) to further the career of a promising young driver. The 25th anniversary convention drew 800 delegates, who listened to a heavyweight lineup of domestic and imported auto industry executives sing their praises... it was the Golden Age of Factory Racing, to be sure.

Closer to home, Glen Region members were not resting on their laurels, as coverage of three events showed. In January, the Region's display at the Corning Lions Auto Show had included Gordon Barkley's Autodynamics Vee, Vic Franzese's Lola Formula B, Dick Sparling's Lotus 51 (the original Formula Ford), and Dave Erwin's Ferrari GTO as the piece de resistance. (We would have taken the Elva Junior, but we didn't want to steal Dave's thunder, and besides, the frame was being painted.)

The February 9th ice gymkhana at Waneta Lake was blessed (?) with snow rather than slush, and showed the superiority of four-wheel-drive long before the Audi Quattro. The top eight times of the day belonged to Jeeps, Scouts, or Land Rovers, while Dick Rathbone took his Mustang around nine seconds faster than any other two-wheel-drive and 17 sec. ahead of any other rear-drive! Forty entries competed, with another four signing in but choosing to sit it out.

A week after the ice event it was back to rallying, with Stu Boysen's Flying Fickle Finger of Fate Rally. The weather improved from January's Snow Rally, but there were some amazing similarities: the same number of cars (29), much of the same territory (Addison, Woodhull, Big Flats), the same finishing point (Morrison's), and the same photographer (Stu Luther, who also did the honors at Waneta Lake). Bill and Sarah Knowlton moved up from second to first, but since they were Central New York Region members, Shirley Brown (driver) and Dave Sonday (navigator) held onto their Glen Region point leads.

On the racing scene, rumors had Pocono being completed in 1970 (it wasn't), Summit Point replacing Marlboro (it did), Lime Rock solving its local ordinance problems (it was a standoff, still no racing on Sunday), and the Central Florida Region patching up its differences at Sebring (apparently they did, but it didn't do much good in the long run).

At the February 15th Rally Board meeting we mailed announcements of the school, rally schedules and membership applications to some 203 non-members, who had participated in any of the final four rallies last year. The effort and modest expense of such a mailing was rewarded by the attendance at the school. When questioned as to how they had learned about the event, the vast majority responded that it was via the direct mailing, while some had heard it advertised on the radio and some had read about it in Ron Levanduski's racing column in the Star-Gazette. I also saw a number of people filling out membership applications at the school, so hopefully the number of members rallying will begin to show an increase.

Connie Davies has completed redesigning our self-score sheet, and she did a super job. The form is very "clean" and includes instructions for completing it. I'm sure it will be very well received by both new rallyists and those who have struggled with the old form in the past.

The next event on the schedule is the "Lions Journey For Sight", the 4th annual White Cane Rally on April 1st. If you want to drive for a blind or visually impaired navigator, please contact Ed and Gail Cordes (607 562-8097). There will also be an open class (for sighted navigators), so the event is open to all with a \$25 donation to the Southern Tier Association for the Blind.

#### Pylon Parade

I've received lots of questions about the price hike in entry fees for Solo II. Here's why the prices were raised.

First, we have revived the Divisional Points Fund. Fifty cents from every entry will go into a fund to help cover the entry fee cost of qualified Glen Region drivers at the NEDiv Solo II Championships. The idea behind this fund is to stimulate interest in the regional program and to encourage regional drivers to enter higher levels of competition. This fund is open to Glen Region members who compete or participate in 75% of Glen Region Championship events prior to the NEDiv Championships in August. They must be one of the top three drivers in their class according to the points standings and can not have received over \$100 in award money from the Pro Solo II Series. If any of the top three drivers chooses not to enter, then the next qualified driver in the class will be eligible for the fund. This fund covers only the entry fee to the NEDiv Championships.

Reason number two is economic. We have several capital expenses this year, (new battery for the timers, new pylons and scoreboards), which, although these items are charged to the club and not directly to Solo II, we feel they have to be covered by our program. Member entry fees have not been raised since 1982. We are attemping to keep the difference between member and non-member entry fees large enough to encourage non-members to join the club. Finally, the worst reason is that surrounding regions have charged higher entry fees and we feel it is time to bring ourselves in line with their pricing. We still are less expensive then most surrounding regions when it comes to entry fees, Solo II or rally.

We will try to give you your money's worth. Come out and test the Water.

Don't forget about the Glen Region season pass for Solo II. All the Solo II Board members have these passes for sale and they will be available through the end of the first Solo II on April 8th. Don't miss Dave Rothchild's event on April 8th at the Westinghouse plant in Horseheads. Registration starts at 9:30.

Other board members are Joe Atkinson and Arnie Carbaugh who will gladly take your calls. Dave Snyder and Joe Carozzoni are a little out of the way but we are all willing to listen to your calls.

A reminder that the sites listed in the Solo II calendar are tenative, especially the Invitational at the track. All sites through June have been confirmed and we are working on new sites to bring you new and improved Solo IIs.
