The Activities Director





Solo II in the Streets



Mark's Maintenance Tips

As I vacationed on a nice and hot sunny island, it came to me to write an article on heat and stress. My two favorite activities on vacation are lying in the sun drinking frostie drinks (heat) and scuba diving (stress). In a very indirect way this applies to your racing car.

Let's go with heat. First, we covered the cooling system in the last article, but other things are under extreme heat, such as: wheel bearings, CV joints, brake calipers and rotors, and exhaust systems, to name a few.

Wheel bearings - some guys have never taken their hubs off to check and have run years that way. That's plain lucky. Repack your wheel bearings prior to the season. Depending on how many races you run, you may want to repack them more often. Every four races is a nice rule to go by.

CV joints - about the same as wheel bearings; Don't worry about the balls falling out of the CV. It is contrary to popular belief, but they are able to be reassembled. It's like a Rubik's Cube, but manageable.


Brake calipers - take the brake pads out, slowly pump the brakes, exposing the pistons, spray with W-D 40 and clean throughly. We do this every race weekend to keep the calipers nice and clean.

Rotors - check for acceptable run out. If not acceptable, have the rotors turned.

Exhaust systems - look for cracks and fractures, which are always a problem. Keep your eyes open for them.

As I know I'm running on, I'll talk on stress in the next article.
