The Dam-Mountain XIII Rally, chaired once again by Bill and Pauline Bradshaw, hosted 21 cars on June 24th. Some rallyists love Bradshaw rallies, because they are always challenging - some hate them, because they are always tricky, but everyone remembers them because they always have a special twist.. or two.. or three.

D-M XIII will be memorable in that it was run on the straight - ahead principle - a once very popular rally format that in the past few years has given way, almost exclusively, to the main - road principle. This twist proved challenging, to both the newer rallyists, who'd never used that principle before, and the veterans, who found themselves second guessing each intersection - usually two miles further along.

A very pleasant twist was the transit zone at the Troy Tastee Freeze where rallyists were treated to an ice cream cone. The new area the rally covered (roughly South of Rt. 328 between Rts. 14 and 15) was a welcome change of scenery and would have been spectacular on a decent day - yes it rained on our parade again.

The rally program has a dynamite line-up for the second half of the season, which began on July 15 with the "Wrath of Khan - Cord" and which ended at the Greyton H. Taylor Wine Museum for a buffet and winery tour at Bully Hill. Details next month.

August 5th will find us at Eldridge Park, Elmira for a picnic following the Buckbee's rally. There will be hot sausage, hot dogs, salad, munchies, desert and beverages — all for only a one dollar addition to the standard rally prices.

On September 23rd plans are in the works for the second "Discover Corning" rally. The Davies' are planning an even bigger and better event than last year that, like the "Solo in the Streets", will need support from the entire club.

The grand finale will come October 27 with the Halloween Rally/Party, chaired by Mike McKerrow and Kelly Buckbee.

Fifteen Years Ago In The SPARKPLUG

Our cover picture of Chris Amon's Ferrari heralded coverage of the first CamAm ever held at the Glen. The 1969 season marked the height of the McLaren era, or the Bruce and Denny Show as it was sometimes called, and no one was surprised when the orange cars finished first and second at Watkins Glen. In fact, the most surprising thing may have been that 55,000 people turned out to watch a race in which the result was a foregone conclusion. Of course, a Ferrari entry was was sure to be a crowd-puller, and Amon's red screamer was a sensory delight. It even held together to finish third, one of its best performances in a trouble-plagued season.

The Six-Hour Race was shifted back to Saturday with the arrival of the CanAm and was almost lost in the shuffle. Despite the entry of a full Matra team, the semiworks Salzburg Porsches had no difficulty finishing first and second. The winner, driven by the peerless team of Jo Siffert and Brian Redman, was a streamlined 908/2 roadster which bore the inscription "Osterreich 1" bobsled-fashion across the nose.

At a slightly different level of competion, six Glen Region members took part in the annual Driver's School, half of them in Mini-Coopers! Rick Perry, Bill Petrie, and Pat Colby all ran the flying shoeboxes, while Gary Grove had an MG Midget, and Jim Ostrum ran Bud Proulx's MGA. Rounding out the Glen contingent was none other than Homer Snert himself, Dick Sparling, in his Lotus 51 Formula Ford.

Finally, the political cauldron was still bubbling over Jim Kaser's talks with USAC, with strong words like "sellout" making their way into the discussion. I observed editorially that maybe the best thing to come out of the turmoil would be a restructuring of club racing. I'm still waiting.
